

<u>HISTORY</u>

• <u>July, 2021</u>

- To avoid liability in > 3,000 opioid-related law suits, manufacturer J&J and the "Big 3" distributors agreed to resolve all those cases with a ^{\$}26 billion offer. Agreement is with the states.
- States entitled to ½ of the offered payouts. To unlock full amount to a state, 90% of counties & municipalities/townships surrender individual suits and join the state agreement.

• <u>December, 2021</u>

 Counties & municipalities/townships enter Illinois Opioid Allocation Agreement with Illinois Attorney General – over 90% reached. Illinois enters multi-state agreement – slated to receive ^{\$}760 million over 18 years.

• <u>July, 2022</u>

 Illinois passed PA102-0085 prohibiting a local government from litigating against a company subject to a multi-state opioid settlement agreement unless approved by the Illinois AG.

October 2022

- Payments for years 1 and 2 were made to counties and municipalities/townships.
- <u>Current</u>
 - Other federal settlements have been made, and more will be coming.

Allocation Agreement

- Participating Local Governments are original counties and municipalities/townships who agreed to participate by September 1, 2020 and additional ones who entered agreement by January 2, 2022.
- Funds to Illinois to be distributed as follows:
 - 15% is divided among the municipalities/townships by formula
 - 10% is divided among the counties by formula
 - 20% goes to the State
 - 55% goes to the Opioid Remediation Fund to fund Opioid-related programs, managed by the Illinois Opioid Remediation Advisory Board
- Funds from future national drug company settlements will be placed in the Illinois Opioid Remediation Fund and distributed per the Allocation Agreement.

USE OF FUNDS

- The Opioid Remediation Advisory Board recommended the allocation percentages to municipalities/townships and counties to achieve "equitable" distribution. Factors the Advisory Board considered are the following:
 - Population
 - Opioid Usage Rates
 - Overdose Deaths
 - The amount of opioids shipped into a region
- Settlement Funds Must be Used for Remediation and Abatement:
 - Settlement Agreement Exhibit B (15-pages) details approved abatement programs and uses, which include the following with which FDs and FPDs may be involved:
 - Expanding training for first responders, schools, community support groups and families
 - \circ Increasing distribution of FDA-approved opioid reversal drugs such as Naloxone and others
 - Supporting efforts to discourage or prevent misuse of opioids through funding media campaigns, public education related to drug disposal, and school-based or youth-focused programs or strategies that have demonstrated effectiveness in preventing drug misuse

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- Quarterly Financial Reporting to the Illinois Attorney General's Office is required to itemize:
 - Payments Received
 - Program Expenditures
 - Non-Abatement Expenditures

FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICTS AND NON-PARTICIPATING MUNICIPALITIES

- The Allocation Agreement is clear that "Subdivisions" include municipalities/townships and counties – not any special districts like Fire Protection Districts.
- For municipalities/townships not already signed-on, it is too late. Illinois Attorney General's Office can be contacted to confirm.
- FDs from non-participating municipalities and FPDs can request funding for approved settlement programs (including those for first responders) through their counties.
